Limit access to keys, and track who has them.



Restrict access to storage areas even during business hours.



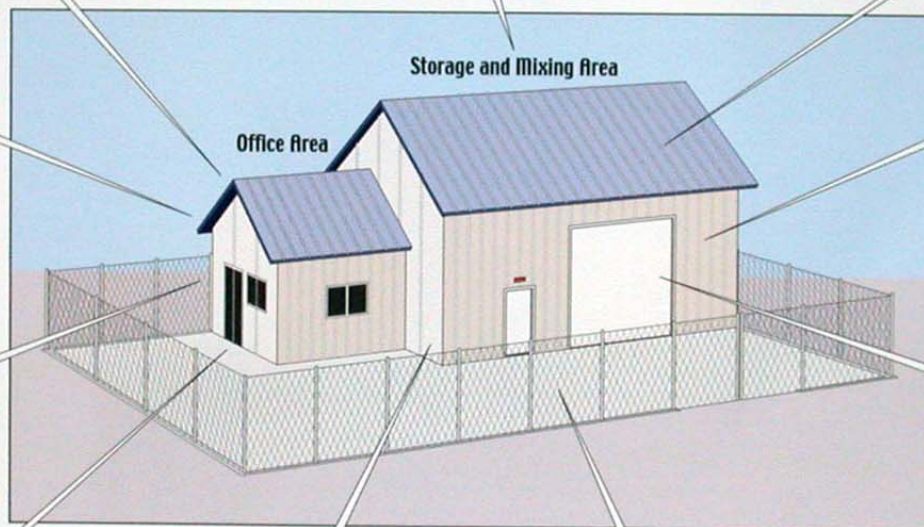
Inspect storage areas regularly for signs of tampering and notify police if any are found.



Update inventory records regularly and keep your local fire department informed.



Have labels and Material Safety Data Sheets for all products on the premises.



Post emergency contacts, including the name and phone number for at least 2 people, the police, and the fire department.



Keep application equipment in a secure location and remove keys to prevent theft or sabotage.



Keep a log of visitors and deliveries, require ID's from anyone claiming official business, and call their company or agency if suspicious.



Storage areas should be well lit and sturdy. Consider using a security or surveillance system.



Lock unattended storage areas.



Establish emergency plans with local authorities and post signs if required.
